PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT.

FRED. G. D. BEDFORD, Governor.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

HEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that the Governor may, whenever he shall think fit, by proclamation or otherwise prorogue Parliament and dissolve the Legislative Assembly: And whereas the Parliament stands prorogued until the thirty-first day of May, 1904: And whereas it is expedient to dissolve the Legislative Assembly: Now Therefore I, the said Governor of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Constitution Act, 1889," do by this Proclamation dissolve the Legislative Assembly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this eighteenth day of May, 1904.
