# WESTERN AUSTRALIA,) By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland, TO WIT. Count della Catena, Knight Commander of G. STRICKLAND, Governor. [L.s.] Its Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland, Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., the Instruction of St.

WHEREAS by "The Circuit Courts Act, 1897," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare is such portions of the State of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form Circuit Districts, and shall assign a name to each of such Districts, and define the boundaries of the same respectively; and may, in like manner, increase or decrease the number of such districts, and may alter the name and boundaries of any Circuit District; and a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held in every such District, once at least every three months, at a time and place to be appointed by the Governor by the like or any subsequent Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation dated 22nd day of May, 1902, the then Governor declared by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that a portion of the State contained within the boundaries defined in the said Proclamation be constituted a Circuit District, and appointed the third Wednesday in June as one of the times at which a sitting of the Supreme Court should be held at Kalgoorlie, in the said District: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the time for holding the said sitting of the Supreme Court: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint Tuesday, the 27th day of June, 1911, in lieu of Wednesday, the 21st day of June, 1911, as the time at which a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held at Kalgoorlie in the said District.

Amendment of Boundaries of the Lawlers and Wiluna Districts of the East Murchison Goldfield.

#### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the Lawlers and Wiluna Districts of the East Murchison Goldfield, the boundaries of which are to be as follows:—

#### Lawlers District.

Starting at a point on the East boundary of the Black Range District about 8 miles South of its North-East corner and about 30½ miles North of the 43-mile post on the Lawlers-Berrigrin Road; thence East passing through Mt. Falconer and a point about 1½ miles North of the Bronzewing group of leases to a point on the East boundary of the Murchison Goldfield situate about 90 miles South from its North-East corner; thence South along part of the Eastern® boundary of the East Murchison Goldfield about 64 miles; thence West about 62 miles; thence South passing through the 24-mile post on the Lawlers-Leonora Telegraph Line about 23 miles; thence West passing through Trig. Station E57, on Peperill Hill, about 50 miles to the East boundary of the Black Range District; thence North along the East boundary of the Black Range District, through a point about 2½ miles West of Mt. Holmes near the Wallaby Nob Well, on the Black Range-Lawlers Road, and through the 43-mile post on the Lawlers-Berrigrin Road about 86½ miles to the starting point.

#### Wiluna District.

Bounded by lines starting from the 302-mile post on the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence North-Easterly along the Western boundary of the East Murchison Goldfield to its North-West corner; thence East along the North boundary of the East Murchison Goldfield to its
