PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, }

G. STRICKLAND, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Sir Gerald Strickland, Count della Catena, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

695/11. WHEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that the Governor may prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly, and dissolve the Legislative Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: And whereas the Legislative Assembly by Proclamation or otherwise, to the 19th day of October now next ensuing: And whereas it is expedient to dissolve the Legislative Assembly: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by "The Constitution Act, 1889," do by this my Proclamation dissolve the Legislative Assembly.
