WHEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly as from and after the sixteenth day of January instant, until the sixteenth day of April next.
