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THE PLANT DISEASES ACT, 1914.

WHEREAS it appears to me on the report of an Inspector (or the Under Secretary) that disease, that is to say, Fruit Fly, exists (or has within the preceding three months existed) in the orchard described in Part I. of the Schedule hereto and occupied by Mr. R. Muir, and that it is expedient to declare such orchard, together with the area of land described in Part II. of the Schedule hereto, contiguous to (or surrounding) such orchard to be infected: Now, therefore, I do by this notice declare, pursuant to Section 11 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," that the above-mentioned orchard, together with the said area of land, is infected.

Part I.

All that area of land occupied by Mr. R. Muir and situate at Earl Street, Albany.

Part II.

All that area of land enclosed by a line drawn from the shore at Princess Royal Harbour at Bay Street; along Bay Street to Public Park at Mt. Melville; thence along the boundary of the Park to a lane mid-way between Cross Street and Ashwell Street; thence to Albany Road; thence to the Hordern Monument; thence along Middleton Road to Rowley Road; thence to the Public Park at Mt. Clarence; thence along the Park boundary to Malcolm Street, and thence to Princess Royal Harbour.



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
