WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893, Amendment Act, 1896," all lands whereof His Majesty may become the registered proprietor may by Proclamation be revested in His Majesty as of his former estate: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revest in His Majesty, as of his former estate, Kojonup Town Lot 20, registered at the Office of Titles in Volume CCLXVII., folio 150, as from the surrender thereof to His Majesty on the 7th day of April, 1917.

WHEREAS by a Crown Lease under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the office of Land Titles as Crown Lease No. 773/15, Ninghan Location 1602 was granted to Donald John McPherson Smith as Conditional Purchase Lease 34748/55, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon posses-

sion of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvement works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of "Quarry" (Gravel): Now know Ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Lease as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being a portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Crown Lease, was on the 5th day of December, 1917, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of "Quarry" (Gravel).

*The Schedule.*

The area, comprising 1 acre 0 roods 8 perches, and bounded by lines starting from the South-Eastern corner of Ninghan Location 1602, and extending 255deg. 19min., 7 chains; thence 359deg. 58min., 1 chain 55 links; thence 75deg. 19min., 7 chains; and thence 179 deg. 58min., 1 chain 55 links, to the starting point. (Plan 56/80.)
