Prices Regulation Act, 1919.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, in Perth, this
1st day of April, 1920.

Present:

The Honourables—The Premier (Senior Member),
The Minister for Mines,
The Colonial Secretary.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," it is enacted that the maximum prices (retail or wholesale) that may be charged in any proclaimed area for any food-stuff or necessary commodities may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, be determined by Order in Council: Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, determine that the maximum wholesale prices of fresh milk in the Metropolitan Area shall be as follows:—

- (a) If delivered at a Depôt, one shilling and five-pence per gallon;
- (b) If delivered *ex* a Depôt, one shilling and six-pence half-penny per gallon, inclusive of all charges for cooling and storage;

the usual terms and conditions in other respects to apply.

And that this Order shall have effect from the first day of April, 1920.
