

14. No person shall bring into the market any stand, table, or other similar contrivance or thing without the sanction of the Market Inspector.
15. If any person persists in occupying any standing place, table, or trough contrary to the foregoing provisions after having been requested by the Inspector to quit the same, he may be summarily ejected therefrom and his goods removed.
16. All persons purchasing fish in the Market shall remove the same from the tables (or trolleys) from which it may have been sold immediately after the sale thereof.
17. No person shall bring into or upon the Market any goods, merchandise, or provisions of any kind other than fish for the purpose of selling or exposing or offering the same for sale.
18. In the Schedule to this By-law, whenever the term "half-bushel basket, equal to 40lbs. in weight," occurs, or the term "bushel basket, equal to 80lbs. in weight," occurs, the said term or either of them shall be read and construed to include any lesser part or weight thereof respectively.
19. No person shall attach to or suspend from the South Jetty any cage, crate, box, or receptacle for the storage of crayfish without the permission of the Council and then only in such a manner so that no damage shall be done to the Jetty.
20. The market will be open for the wholesale sale of fish between the hours of 5.45 and 9.0 in the morning and 3 and 5 in the afternoon. Sales of fish will be held by the Council's auctioneer at such times during the hours mentioned as shall from time to time be notified by notice under the hand of the Town Clerk posted in the Market premises, but so as not to exceed two hours in the morning and one hour in the afternoon.
21. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Inspector, sell, offer, or expose for sale any fish during the time appointed for the holding of auction sales of fish by the Council's auctioneer.

SCHEDULE OF TOLLS, DUES AND FEES PAYABLE UNDER THESE BY-LAWS.

There may be levied and charged by the Council the tolls, dues, and fees specified hereunder:—

For the use of each table per sale—1s. 6d.

For permission to attach to or suspend from the jetty any cage, crate, box, or receptacle for the storage of crayfish—the sum of £3 per cage, crate, box, or receptacle per annum.
