WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Prisons Act, 1903-1918," the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare any Police Station or Lock-up to be a Police Gaol: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of all powers in this behalf enabling, do hereby declare the Lock-up at Geraldton to be a Police Gaol within the meaning of the said "Prisons Act, 1903-1918."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Regulation hereinafter mentioned, in the manner hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of all powers in this behalf enabling, do hereby amend Regulation 11 of the Swan River Regulations made and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th June, 1917, by inserting the words "more than two tons measurement and" between the words "of" and "less," in the first line thereof, and by omitting the words "net registered tonnage," in the second line of such Regulation, and, further, by adding at the end of the said Regulation the following paragraph:—

"Every rowing or sailing boat exceeding two tons measurement navigating the river at night shall be provided with a lantern of approved design, from which shall be temporarily exhibited a white light in sufficient time to prevent collision."

The amendments to the foregoing Regulation shall come into operation upon the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.
