Dissolution of the Legislative Assembly.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Francis
To WIT.

J Alexander Newdegate, Knight
Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St.
George, Governor in and over the
State of Western Australia and its
Dependencies in the Commonwealth
of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that the Governor may prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, and dissolve the Legislative Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: And whereas the Legislative Council and the Legislative

Assembly stand prorogued to the 29th day of January instant: And whereas it is expedient to dissolve the Legislative Assembly: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by "The Constitution Act, 1889," do by this my Proclamation dissolve the Legislative Assembly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 28th day of January, 1924.
