NOTICE is hereby given that, at the Special Meeting of the Executive Council held at Government House on Tuesday, the 28th day of October, 1924, at 12.30 o'clock p.m., Sir William Robert Campion reported that he had received from His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet appointing him Governor of Western Australia, which Commission was read by the Clerk as follows:

## WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Commission passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, appointing Brevet Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, K.C.M.G., D.S.O., to be Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

George the Fifth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To Our Trusty and Wellbeloved Sir William Robert Campion, Lieutenant Colonel and Brevet Colonel on the Retired List of Our Territorial Army, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of Our Distinguished Service Order, Greeting.

We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Sir William Robert Campion, to be during Our pleasure, Our Gov-ernor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

II. And We do hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at West-minster the Twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over Our State

of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, and according to such Orders and Instructions as the Governor for the time being of the said State hath already received, or as you may hereafter receive from Us.

III. And We do hereby appoint that so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Oaths, and have entered upon the duties of your Office of Governor, this Our present Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Twenty-first day of January, 1920, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Francis Alexander Newdigate Newdegate, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, to be Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this 12th day of July, 1924, in the Fifteenth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ire-Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Peland, bearing date at Westminster the 29th day of October, 1900, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria did constitute, order, and declare that there shall be a Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its De-
