THE ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909.

Executive Council Chamber, Perth, 18th December, 1925.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," and to order that such Regulations shall come into force on Monday, the 21st day of December instant; and to repeal, as from the 20th day of December instant, the existing Regulations No. 16 and No. 17 under the said Act as previously published in the Government Gazete.

THE ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909.

Amended Regulations.

Property in viscora and inedible offal.

All stock brought to an abattoir for slaughter shall be admitted to the abattoir on condition that the viscera and inedible offal shall become the property of the Government, unless the owner of the stock states in writing, on an application to the officer in charge of the abattoir for leave to slaughter the stock, that such owner desires to retain the property in the viscera and inedible offal.

The viscera and offal referred to in this Regulation are-

Of large stock-

All fat and trimmings except caul and reed fat. Lungs. Intestines.

Third stomach or bible.

Horns.

Tail tips.

Paunch.

Paunch contents.

Blood.

Feet.

Of lambs, sheep, and goats—
All fat and trimmings except caul fat.

Paunch.

Paunch contents. Blood.

Intestines.

Lungs.

Trotters.

Of pigs— All fat and trimmings except caul fat.

Paunch.

Paunch contents.

Blood.

Intestines.

Lungs.

Fees.

17. The fees to be charged for the use of an abattoir (inclusive of inspection and 24 hours' free storage in the chilling rooms) shall be as follows:—

(a) Where the viscera and inedible offal are not claimed by the owner of the stock, and become the property of the Government-

For every head of large stock For every calf under the age of six months 2 6

For every sheep, lamb, or goat

For every pig .. (b) Where the viscera and inedible offal are claimed

by the owner of the stock-For every head of large stock

For every calf under the age of six months 3 6 For every sheep, lamb, or goat For every pig

With respect to calves, the Officer in Charge shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a calf.

In all cases blood and paunch contents to become the property of the Government without payment.
