## TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1926.

## THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1926.

### *Regulations.*

1. These regulations are made under Section 42 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1926" (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") as reprinted in the appendix to the sessional volume of statutes for 1926.

2. In these regulations the words "the Metropolitan Area" mean the metropolitan area as prescribed for the time being by regulation under Section 13 of the Act.

3. The existing routes, as prescribed under the Act by the regulations published in the *Gazette* on the dates specified in the first column of the schedule hereto, and as set out in the second column of the schedule hereto, are hereby adopted and prescribed under Section 42 of the Act, as the routes within the metropolitan area to be observed by omnibuses.

The words "prescribed route" in these regulations mean a route set out in the second column of the schedule hereto, and include any additional routes within the metropolitan area that may be prescribed.

4. The use within the metropolitan area of any vehicle as an omnibus elsewhere than along a "prescribed route" is hereby prohibited.

5. The use, on and after the 1st day of October, 1927, within the metropolitan area, of any vehicle as an omnibus is hereby prohibited—

- (a) unless a "prescribed route" is specified in or indorsed on the license for such vehicle, by the Commissioner of Police as the local authority in the metropolitan area; and
