PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 251.

Retail Price of Groceries.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 251.
2. Prices Control Order No. 218, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 231, is hereby further amended—
 - (a) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the word "Gardener" appearing in the subheading "I.X.L., O.K., Rosella, S.P.C., Gardener, Glen Ewin, and Victoree" under the heading of "Jams";
 - (b) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the maximum prices appearing in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of such Schedule opposite the items specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order, and inserting in their stead the maximum prices specified in relation to the said items in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of the lastmentioned Schedule;
 - (c) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the items specified in the first column and the prices for such items specified in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of the Second Schedule to this Order;
 - (d) by inserting at the end of the Schedule thereto the items specified in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order, and the maximum prices for such items specified in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of such lastmentioned Schedule.
