

THE ASSOCIATIONS INCORPORATION ACT,
1895.

The following is a copy of the Memorial intended to be filed in the Supreme Court under the provisions of the said Act.

Memorial of the Kalamunda Gymkhana
Committee.

1. Name of the Institution—Kalamunda Gymkhana Committee.
2. Objects of the Association—(a) The raising of funds towards the maintenance and assistance of any advancement in the ideals of pre-school kindergarten education of children, infant health work from all and any specific aspect; Kalamunda Hospital and Ambulance Committee. (b) It is the express intention that moneys raised in excess of expenses, purchase of equipment for the efficient running of the gymkhana and maintenance thereof, shall be spent only on the Kalamunda Kindergarten Committee, Kalamunda Infant Health Centre Incorporated, and the Kalamunda Hospital and Ambulance Committee to their activities within the Darling Range Road Board area, such moneys being distributed on an equal basis. (c) However, any Committee may forgo its financial share in any year to an associate charitable organisation functioning in the district, but any such move must have the majority approval of the other two committees at a duly constituted general meeting. (d) The gymkhana may take the form of any sporting or associated attraction within keeping of its name. (e) No member will receive any remuneration or pecuniary benefit from the association activities, but this does not exclude payments for services rendered or honorariums.
3. Where Situated or Established—Kalamunda.
4. Name or Names of Trustees—Leonard Marwood Bennett, Kindergarten Committee; Leo Feddersen, Ambulance and Hospital Committee; West De Young, Infant Health Committee.
5. In whom the Management of the Institution is Vested, and by what Means—Executive committee, trustees, pursuant to the constitution of the Association.
