PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA. TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor. [L.S.]	} By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Medical Act, 1894-1952, where the Governor in Council is satisfied that a service is not adequately provided for in respect of medical and surgical facilities, the said Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare such service to be an auxiliary service within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore, the Governor in Council in and over the State of Western Australia, being satisfied that the service specified in the Schedule hereunder is not adequately provided for in respect of medical or surgical facilities, hereby proclaims the service to be an auxiliary service under the provisions of the said Act.
