PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, it WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thesday, the 6th day of April 1954. until Tuesday the 6th day of April, 1954.

in the House of Parliament in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

WHEREAS by paragraphs (c) and (d) of section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1952, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of the opinion that a proclamation made pursuant to section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1952, should be varied or cancelled he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that if of the opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may by subsequent proclamation vary or cancel a former proclamation; and whereas the Commissioner is of the opinion that a proclama-tion made pursuant to section 28A of the said Act on the 17th day of December, 1953, should be varied as hereinafter described and has made recommen-dation to the Governor accordingly; and whereas I. the Governor of the said State am of the opinion I, the Governor of the said State, am of the opinion that such recommendation should be given effect: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do proclaim that the proclamation given under my hand and Public Seal and dated the 17th day of December, 1953, and published in Government Gazette dated the 24th day of Decem-
