Principal Regulations.

1. The regulations made pursuant to section 41A of the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899 (as amended), published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of January, 1947, and amended by notices published in the Government Gazette on the 25th November, 1949, the 10th April, 1952, the 19th July, 1956, the 1st May, 1957 and the 26th February, 1959, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 2 amended.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by adding to paragraph B the following proviso:—

Provided that when travelling to the Eastern States of Australia on board a ship or on a train, reimbursement of expenses shall be at a rate equal to thirty per centum of the amount of the first class single boat fare, or as the case may be, the first class single rail fare,
