Suitors' Fund Act, 1964. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John TO WIT, Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 2 of the Suitors' Fund Act, 1964, that the Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation, and that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole Act shall come into operation on one day, but the several sections of the Act may be proclaimed to come into operation on such days as are respectively fixed by Proclamation; and as are respectively fixed by Proclamation; and whereas it now appears to me desirable and expedient that sections 8 to 17, inclusive, of the said Act shall come into operation: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 2nd day of August, 1965, as the day on which sections 8 to 17, inclusive, of the Suitors' Fund Act, 1964, shall come into operation.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 7th day of July, 1965, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:-

> Land Act, 1933-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:-

Corres. 2251/60.—That Reserve No. 27465 (Kalamunda Lot 468) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalamunda in trust for the purpose of Recreation (excluding use of the land for Public Camping and Caravan Park).

2961/63.—That Reserve No. (Rockingham Lot 1209) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Rockingham in trust for the purpose of a Depot Site.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said

Forests Act, 1913-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:-

- (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation;
- (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.
