### TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1966.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, 1919-1966, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule, hereunder.

#### Schedule. Regulations.

Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic Code, 1965, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th December, 1965, and amended by regulations so published on the 20th January, 1966, the 31st May, 1966, and the 7th September, 1966, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 103 amended. 2. Regulation 103 of the principal regulations is amended by adding, after the interpretation, "restriction sign", the following interpretation:—

"roundabout" means an intersection that is laid out for the movement of vehicular traffic, in one direction, around a traffic island:

#### Schedule. Regulations.

Principal regulations. 1. In these regulations the Road Traffic Code, 1965, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th December, 1965, and amended by regulations so published on the 20th January, 1966, the 31st May, 1966, and the 7th September, 1966, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Reg. 1608A added. Securing of loads. 2. The principal regulations are amended by adding, after regulation 1608, the following regulation:—

1608A. A person shall not drive a vehicle carrying a load, unless the load is so arranged, contained, fastened or covered that the load or any part of it cannot fall or otherwise escape from the vehicle.
