FREMANTLE PORT AUTHORITY ACT, 1902-1965.

THE Fremantle Port Authority, acting pursuant to the provisions of the Fremantle Port Authority Act, 1902-1965, hereby makes the regulations set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Principal Regulations. 1. In these regulations, the regulations made by the Fremantle Port Authority, under the Fremantle Port Authority Act, 1902-1965, reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, and published as sc reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th September, 1967, with all amendments up to and including the 14th February, 1966, and amended from time to time thereafter by notices so published, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. Regulation No. 141 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the passage commencing with the words "Charges on goods" in line fifteen and ending with the item "Woolpacks in bales . . . 14 cubic feet each." and substituting the following passage:-
