PROCLAMATION

To all to whom these Presents shall come,

GREETING:

WHEREAS by a Commission dated the 19th June, 1974, I, James Maxwell Ramsay, was duly appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia; and whereas in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal being dated at Westminster, the 29th day of October, 1900, constituting the office of Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia it is provided: that in the event of the office of the Governor becoming vacant the Lieutenant-Governor shall during Her Majesty's pleasure, administer the Government of the State, first taking the Oaths in those Letters Patent directed to be taken by the Governor and in the manner therein prescribed; which being done the Lieutenant-Governor is by those

Letters Patent authorised, empowered, and commanded by Her Majesty to do and execute, during Her Majesty's pleasure, all things that belong to the Office of Governor according to the tenor of those Letters Patent and according to the instructions to the said Governor mentioned therein and the Laws of the State; and whereas the office of the Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia has become vacant: Now this is to give notice that I, the said James Maxwell Ramsay, have duly taken the Oaths required by the Letters Patent and have, in pursuance of the Letters Patent, this day assumed the office of Administrator of the Government of the State and by the terms of the Letters Patent Her Majesty doth require and command all officers and Ministers and all the other the inhabitants of the State, to be obedient, aiding and assisting unto me the said Administrator.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this third day of April, Nineteen hundred and seventy-five.
