NOTICE is hereby given that, at the special meet-NOTICE is hereby given that, at the special meet-ing of the Executive Council held on board the ship "Centaur" at Fremantle on Monday, the 24th day of November, 1975 at 9.45 a.m. Air Chief Marshal Sir Wallace Kyle reported that he had received from Her Majesty's Secretary of State Foreign and Commonwealth Office, a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet appointing him Governor of Western Australia, which Commission was read by the Clerk as follows—

#### WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

COMMISSION passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet appointing Air Chief Marshal Sir Wallace Kyle, G.C.B., C.B.E., D.S.O., D.F.C., to be Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia. ELIZABETH R.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Pritain and Northern Ireland and of Her other Realms and Northern Ireland and of Her other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Wallace Kyle, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of Our Dis-tinguished Service Order, upon whom has been conferred the decoration of the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Chief Marshal on the Retired List of Our Royal Air Force, Greeting:

I. We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Sir Wallace Kyle, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Common-wealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges and advantages to the said Office belong-ing or appertaining ing or appertaining.

II. And We do hereby authorise, empower and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal, bear-ing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amend-ing, or substituted for the same, and according to such Orders and Instructions as the Governor for the time being of the said State hath already Peceived, or as you may hereafter receive from Us received, or as you may hereafter receive from Us.

III. And We do hereby appoint that so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Oaths, and have entered upon the duties of your Office of Governor, this Our present Commission shall supersede the Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Seventh day of December, 1973, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Hughie Idwal Edwards, upon whom has been conferred the decoration of the Victoria Cross, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Com-panion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of Our Distinguished Service Order, Officer of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom has been conferred the decora-tion of the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Commodore on the Retired List of Our Royal Air Force, to be Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies. Australia and its Dependencies.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers and loving subjects in Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given at Our Court of Saint James's, this Thirtieth day of September, 1975, in the Twenty-fourth Year of Our Reign.
