ADMINISTRATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE STATE

NOTICE is hereby given that, His Excellency the Governor being unable, because of illness, to act as Governor and not having appointed a deputy under Clause XVI of the Letters Patent dated 14 February 1986 constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and providing for persons appointed to administer the government of the State, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor the Honourable Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt A.C., K.C.M.G., Q.C. issued the following proclamation—

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA FRANCIS BURT, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator. By His Excellency the Honourable Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt, Companion of the Order of Australia, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Queen's Counsel, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia.

WHEREAS Professor Gordon Reid, Companion of the Order of Australia, Governor of the State of Western Australia is unable because of illness, to act as Governor: AND WHEREAS I, Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt, was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the State by a Commission dated 19 April 1977:

AND WHEREAS the Governor has not appointed a deputy under Clause XVI of the Letters Patent dated 14 February 1986 constituting the office of the Governor of the State of Western Australia and providing for persons appointed to administer the government of the State:

NOW I, Sir Francis Theodore Page Burt, proclaim and declare that, under Clauses XI and XIII of those Letters Patent, I have this day assumed the administration of the government of the State, and that, under Clause XIV of those Letters Patent, I have and may perform and exercise the powers and functions of the Governor.
