7. Minister for Health.
8. Minister for Productivity and Labour Relations; Minister assisting the Minister for Education with TAFE; Minister assisting the Minister for Public Sector Management.
9. Minister for Transport; Racing and Gaming; Tourism.
10. Minister for Agriculture; Water Resources; North-West.
11. Minister for Local Government; Fisheries; Sport and Recreation; Youth; Minister assisting the Minister for Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs.
12. Minister for Police; Emergency Services; The Aged.
13. Minister for Housing; Consumer Affairs.
14. Minister for Community Services; Justice; South-West.
15. Minister for Works; Services; Regional Development; Minister assisting the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs.
16. Minister for Education; Parliamentary and Electoral Reform.
