NOTICE OF ADMINISTRATION OF STATE

On 18 April 1999 the Governor of the State of Western Australia, Major General Philip Michael Jeffery, AC, MC, left the State. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, the Honourable David Kingsley Malcolm, AC, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia issued the following proclamation—

The Governor of the State of Western Australia, Major General Philip Michael Jeffery, Companion of the Order of Australia, Officer of the Order of Australia (Military Division), Military Cross—

- (a) has left the State and will be absent from it for the period 18 to 20 April 1999 (both dates inclusive);
- (b) will be administering the government of the Commonwealth of Australia for the period 21 April to 5 May 1999 (both dates inclusive); and
- (c) will be absent from the State for the period 6 to 16 May 1999 (both dates inclusive).

The Governor has not appointed a deputy under Clause XVI of the *Letters Patent Relating to the Office of Governor of the State of Western Australia* dated 14 February 1986.

I, David Kingsley Malcolm, Companion of the Order of Australia, was appointed Lieutenant-Governor by a commission dated 19 March 1990.

I, David Kingsley Malcolm, Companion of the Order of Australia, proclaim and declare that, under Clauses XI and XIII of those Letters Patent, I have assumed the administration of the government of the State and, under Clause XIV of those Letters Patent, may perform and exercise the powers and functions of the Governor.
