# FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994

SHARK BAY SNAPPER MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT 2007

Made by the Minister under section 54.

### 1. Citation

This instrument is the Shark Bay Snapper Management Plan Amendment 2007.

## 2. Management Plan amended

The amendment in this instrument is to the Shark Bay Snapper Management Plan 1994\*.

#### 3. Clause 12 replaced

Clause 12 is repealed and the following clause inserted instead—

# "12. Capacity of the Fishery

- (1) For the period ending on 31 August 2007 the capacity of the Fishery is 297,250 kilograms of snapper (whole weight).
- (2) For the period commencing on 1 September in any year the capacity of the Fishery is 276,750 kilograms of snapper (whole weight). ".
