## **CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT ACT 1984**

PROPOSED CAMDEN SOUND MARINE PARK

Notice is hereby given under section 14 of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* (CALM Act) of a proposal to reserve Western Australian waters in the Camden Sound area under section 13(1) of the CALM Act as a Class A marine park.

Any person may make a written submission on this proposal and all persons with an interest in the proposal are encouraged to do so.

A marine park is created to protect natural features and aesthetic, scientific and educational values whilst at the same time enabling compatible recreational and commercial uses (the statutory purpose of marine parks is provided in CALM Act section 13B(1)).

Situated in the Indian Ocean, the proposed Camden Sound Marine Park comprises Western Australian waters, the airspace above those waters, the seabed below those waters, and the subsoil to a depth of 200 metres below that seabed that are—

(a) contained within and bounded by a line—

- (i) commencing north-west of Champagny Island at the intersection of the seaward limit of the coastal waters of the State and latitude 15°12′00″ south; and
- (ii) extending east along latitude  $15^{\circ}12'00"$  south to the intersection of that latitude and longitude  $124^{\circ}48'45"$  east;
- (iii) thence north-easterly along the geodesic joining that point and the point at latitude 15°10′51.600" south longitude 124°50′06" east, to the intersection of that geodesic and the high water mark;
- (iv) thence generally south easterly and north westerly along the high water mark around Rothsay Water, Saint George Basin, Prince Regent River, Munster Water and Hanover Bay, to High Bluff;
- (v) thence generally southerly and westerly along the high water mark of Port George IV, Augustus Water and Brecknock Harbour;
- (vi) thence generally southerly along the high water mark to the intersection of that mark and longitude 124°25′00" east at the point nearest latitude 15°52′36" south;
- (vii) thence south along longitude  $124^{\circ}25'00"$  east to the intersection of that longitude and latitude  $16^{\circ}03'00"$  south;
- (viii) thence west along latitude  $16^{9}03\,{}^{\circ}00"$  south to the intersection of that latitude and longitude  $123^{9}45\,{}^{\circ}00"$  east;
  - (ix) thence north along longitude  $123^{\circ}45\,{}^{\circ}00"$  east to the intersection of that longitude and latitude  $15^{\circ}55\,{}^{\circ}00"$  south;
  - (x) thence west along latitude  $15^{\circ}55'00$ " south to the intersection of that latitude and the seaward limit of the coastal waters of the State;
  - (xi) thence generally north-easterly along the seaward limit of the coastal waters of the State to the point of commencement; and
- (b) within that line—
  - (i) seaward of the high water mark of all islands; and
  - (ii) excluding all allocated land (as proclaimed at the time of this notice).

The proposed marine park will be proclaimed within the provisions of the Native Title Act 1993.

NOTES-

- (1) All geographic coordinates are expressed in terms of the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 ('GDA94').
- (2) All geographic co-ordinates are approximate only and are subject to survey.
- (3) 'Western Australian waters' means all waters that are within the limits of the State, or that are 'coastal waters of the State'.
- (4) 'coastal waters of the State' has the meaning given to that term in the *Off-shore (Application of Laws) Act 1982-1983* section 2.
