ORD RIVER DAM CATCHMENT AREA (STRAYING CATTLE).

No. 36 of 1967.

AN ACT to vest in the Crown the property in any Cattle found at large on certain Crown lands; and for incidental and other purposes.

[Assented to 21st November, 1967.]

PE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Ord River Dam Citation. Catchment Area (Straying Cattle) Act, 1967.
- 2. In this Act, "cattle" includes bull, ox, cow, Interpreseer, heifer, horse or mule or their young.

Property in certain cattle to vest in Crown.

- 3. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other Act or law, the property in and the right to possession of any cattle that are, on or after the first day of January, 1969, at large anywhere within the area of land described in the Schedule to this Act, are vested in the Crown, and any such cattle may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Minister from time to time directs.
- (2) No compensation is payable by or on behalf of the Crown by reason of the operation of this Act.

SCHEDULE.

All that area of land formerly comprised in Pastoral Leases Nos. 3114/633 and 3114/526 and resumed under section 109 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, for the purpose of "Regeneration of eroded areas in the Ord River Dam Catchment Area", by proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 14th April, 1967 and described in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 to that proclamation.
