PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES (No. 2).

No. 102 of 1965.

AN ACT to amend the Parliamentary Allowances Act, 1911-1965.

Assented to 17th December, 1965.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:----

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Parlia- Short title and citation. mentary Allowances Act Amendment Act (No. 2), Vol. 13 of the Reprinted 1965

(2) In this Act the Parliamentary Allowances Act, 1911-1965, is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act ⁷³ of 1962 and ³ of 1965. may be cited as the Parliamentary Allowances Act, 1911-1965.

Commencement of allowances. 2. The rates of allowance as altered by this Act shall be deemed to have come into force for all purposes on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and sixty-five.

3. Section three of the principal Act is repealed and re-enacted as follows—

Allowances of members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly.

Ministers of the Crown.

Premier.

Deputy Premier.

Leader of the Government in the Legislative Council. 3. (1) Except as hereinafter provided in this section and section six of this Act, each member of the Legislative Council and each member of the Legislative Assembly is entitled to receive an allowance at the rate of three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

(2) While holding any of the principal executive offices of the Government, liable to be vacated on political grounds, a member of the Legislative Council or a member of the Legislative Assembly is entitled to receive instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of this section, an allowance at the rate of four thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds per annum and in addition—

- (a) for the office of Premier held in conjunction with any of those principal executive offices, an allowance at the rate of one thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds per annum;
- (b) for the office of Deputy Premier held in conjunction with any of those principal executive offices, an allowance at the rate of seven hundred pounds per annum;
- (c) for the office of Leader of the Government in the Legislative Council held in conjunction with any of those principal executive offices, an allowance at the rate of six hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

(3) The member of the Legislative Assembly Leader of the opposition in the who, for the time being, is recognised as the in the Legislative Leader of the Opposition, is entitled to receive Assembly. instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of this section, an allowance at the rate of four thousand two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

(4) The member of the Legislative Assembly who, for the time being is recognised as the Deputy Leader of the Opposition is entitled to Legislative Assembly. receive instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of this section, an allowance at the rate of three thousand six hundred pounds per annum.

(5) The member of the Legislative Council, who, for the time being is recognised as the Legislative Leader of the Opposition in the Legislative Council is entitled to receive instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of this section, an allowance at the rate of three thousand six hundred pounds per annum.

(6) When in addition to the parties whose Leader of respective leaders are the Premier and the party in Legislative Leader of the Opposition, there is in the Assembly. Legislative Assembly any other recognised party of at least seven members, the member of the Legislative Assembly who is the recognised leader for the time being of that party, is entitled to receive, instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of this section, an allowance at the rate of three thousand four hundred pounds per annum. .

(2) The Chairman of Committees of the Legislative Council and the Chairman of Committees of the Legislative Assembly is each entitled to receive an allowance at the rate of three thousand six hundred pounds per annum instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of section three of this Act.

(3) (a) The Government Whip in the Legislative Council and the Opposition Whip in the Legislative Council is each entitled to receive an allowance at the rate of three thousand four hundred and fifty pounds per annum instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of section three of this Act.

(b) The Government Whip in the Legislative Assembly and the Opposition Whip in the Legislative Assembly is entitled to receive an allowance at the rate of three thousand five hundred and fifty pounds per annum instead of the allowance referred to in subsection (1) of section three of this Act. .

5. Section six B of the principal Act is repealed.
