AN ACT to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during its second Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1960-61," for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1961; and to approve of certain expenditure under section forty-one of the Forests Act, 1918-1954.

Presmble.

Most Gracious Sovereign,-

WE, Your Majesty's Most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in Parliament assembled, towards making

good the supply which we have cheerfully granted Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the Sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows (that is to sav):—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, Short title. 1961-62.
- 2. There shall and may be issued and applied, for of moneys. or towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the services of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixtytwo, the following sums, that is to say:-

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Twenty-three Million Seven Hundred and Seventyfour Thousand Seven Hundred and Eight Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund, the sum of Eleven Million Four Hundred and Twenty Thousand Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Three Million Pounds.

3. (1) All sums granted by this Act, and the Acts Appropriation of mentioned in Schedule A to this Act, towards making supplies. good the supply granted to Her Majesty, that is to sav :--

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Fifty-eight Million Seven Hundred and Seventy-four Thousand Seven Hundred and Eight Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of Twenty-one Million Four Hundred and Twenty Thousand Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Five Million Pounds, and

Advance to Treasurer. (2) All sums granted by this Act to supplement grants in confirmation of the expenditure from the vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1960-61," for charges during the year ended the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-one, that is to say:—

From Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Two Million and Forty-nine Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty-nine Pounds Thirteen Shillings.

From the General Loan Fund the sum of One Million One Hundred and Fifty-eight Thousand Six Hundred and Forty-eight Pounds One Shilling and Six Pence.

Schedules B to F. Are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in Schedules B. C. D. E. and F.

Approval of Expenditure under s. 41 of the Forests Act, 1918-1954. Schedule G. 4. An expenditure of One Million and Twenty-three Thousand One Hundred and Forty-seven Pounds on the several works and purposes enumerated in Schedule G to the amounts therein set forth against the respective items in conformity with the scheme of expenditure laid on the Table of the House in accordance with section forty-one of the Forests Act, 1918-1954, is hereby approved.

SCHEDULE D.

ADVANCE TO TREASURER.

To be issued, if and when required, from the Public Account, to enable the Treasurer to make advances to the public officers, also advances for the Trading Concerns, other State Undertakings, Statutory Boards and Treasury Trust Accounts, and for the resumption of land for resale under the provisions of the Industrial Development (Resumption of Land) Act, 1945, and to other persons, or to create Suspense Accounts for the purchase of mechanical appliances, livestock, crops, stores, materials, emergency foodstuffs and payment of wages and costs of services (the amounts to be recovered by disposal or allocation to the Votes or Accounts applicable), or for payments of deposits on Contracts or on account of other Governments, etc., or for payments of an extraordinary nature. Also to pay expenses of an unforeseen nature, chargeable against the Consolidated Revenue Fund, or the General Loan Fund; such disbursements to be transferred monthly to the respective Votes and Services, and to be shown as excesses thereon or as new items. The appropriation may also include expenditure in excess of the provisions of any loan Act pending statutory authority for the raising of such moneys, and the appropriation may also include expenditure, to be charged to Loan Suspense Account, to be subsequently submitted to Parliament for specific appropriation. The whole amount to be adjusted subject as hereinafter provided, not later than 30th June, 1963: Provided that expenditure incurred for minor advances to other persons and balances on Suspense Accounts may be adjusted over such periods as the Treasurer may approve—£5,000,000.
