AN ACT to amend the Stamp Act, 1921-1959.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Stamp Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1960.
- (2) In this Act the Stamp Act, 1921-1959, is referred to as the principal Act.
- (3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Stamp Act, 1921-1960.

- 2. This Act shall come into operation on a day Commencement. to be fixed by proclamation.
- 3. The Second Schedule to the principal Act is Schedule amended by adding after the heading "SETTLE- amended. MENT, DEED OF, or DEED OF GIFT" and the words and expressions thereunder, the following heading, words, figures and expressions-

STATEMENTS ON SALES OF BUTTER FAT-

Any statement written out or caused to be written out by the manager of a dairy produce factory registered under the Dairy Industry Act, 1922, or his agent pursuant to the provisions of the Dairy Cattle Industry Compensation Act, 1960, in respect of the sale of any butter fat, whether payment of the purchase money in respect of any such sale is or is not made in full at the time of the sale or is to be made by instalments or is otherwise deferredThe vendor.
