## AN ACT to amend the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1955.

[Assented to 19th September, 1958.]

**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Constitution  $\frac{\text{Short title}}{\text{and citation.}}$ Acts Amendment Act, 1958.

(2) In this Act the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1955, is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1958.

S. 41A amended. (No. 52 of 1945, s. 3.) 2. Section forty-one A of the principal Act is amended—

- (a) by adding after the passage "Honorary Minister" in line nine the passage ", or who is approved by the Governor as a representative of either House of Parliament or of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association"; and
- (b) by adding after the word "Council" in line sixteen the words "or as such representative".
