AN ACT to authorise the raising of a sum of Fifteen Million Nine Hundred and Fifteen Thousand Pounds by loan for the construction of certain Public Works and Other Purposes, and to authorise the Re-appropriation of Certain Loan Moneys.

[Assented to 18th January, 1957.]

Preamble

WHEREAS it is expedient to authorise the raising, by way of loan of certain sums of money amounting in all to fifteen million nine hundred and fifteen thousand pounds for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned: Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative

Assembly of Western Australia in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Short title. Loan Act, 1956.
- It shall be lawful for the Governor, from time Power to raise money to time, to raise by way of such loan several sums for certain purposes. of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifteen million nine hundred and fifteen thousand pounds, as may be required for the several works and purposes mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act.

3. All sums by this Act authorised to be raised how to be all be paid to the Treasurer and shall be by him applied. shall be paid to the Treasurer, and shall be by him placed to the credit of an account, to be called the General Loan Fund, and shall be applied by the Treasurer to the purposes set forth in the said Schedule in conformity with the annual estimates of the expenditure of the loan moneys sanctioned by Parliament

4. The principal moneys, and interest thereon, Principal and raised under the authority of this Act shall rank charged on Revenue. pari passu with the principal moneys and interest raised and secured by the Stock created and sold under the Loan Act, 1891, and all subsequent Loan Acts, and are hereby charged upon and shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and Assets of the Government of Western Australia.

5. The Governor may from time to time by Advances on account. warrant under his hand authorise the Treasurer to advance and apply to the purposes set forth in the First Schedule to this Act any sums of money not

exceeding in the whole the sum hereby authorised to be raised; and any sums of money so advanced and paid shall be retained by the Treasurer out of any moneys coming to his hands under the authority of this Act.

Re-appropriation from and to. 6. It shall be lawful for the Governor to appropriate out of the sums set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, from the items therein set forth, and to the items enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, the sum of three hundred and fifty thousand pounds to be expended on the works and purposes named in the Third Schedule hereto.
