6° and 7° Geo. VI., No. XLIII.

No. 43 of 1942.

AN ACT to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to Credit of the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during its last Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1941-42," for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1942; and to approve of certain expenditure under section forty-one of the Forests Act, 1918-1931.

[Assented to 23rd December, 1942.]

Most Gracious Sovereign,—

TE, Your Majesty's Most Dutiful and Loyal Sub- Preamble. jects, the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the Sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent

Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows (that is to say):—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1942-43.

Application of moneys.

2. There shall and may be issued and applied, for or towards making good the Supply granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, the following sums, that is to say:—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four Million Five Hundred and Ninety-nine Thousand One Hundred and Eighty-one Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund, the sum of Eight Hundred and Eighty-nine Thousand and Sixty-two Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Appropriation of supplies. Schedule A.

3. (1) All sums granted by this Act, and the Acts mentioned in Schedule A to this Act, towards making good the Supply granted to His Majesty, that is to say:—

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Seven Million Seven Hundred and Ninety-nine Thousand One Hundred and Eighty-one Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of One Million and Eighty-nine Thousand and Sixty-two Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, and

Advance to

(2) All sums granted by this Act to supplement grants in confirmation of the expenditure from the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1941-42," for charges

during the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, that is to sav :--

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four Hundred and Thirteen Thousand One Hundred and Sixteen Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Six-pence.

From the General Loan Fund the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred and Four Pounds Four Shillings and Two-pence

Are appropriated and shall be deemed to have Schedules been appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in Schedules B, C, D, E, and F.

4. An expenditure of Eighty Thousand Pounds Approval of Expenditure on the several works and purposes enumerated in under s. 41 of Schedule G to the amounts therein set forth against Act, 1918-1931. the respective items in conformity with the scheme Schedule G. of expenditure laid on the Table of the House in accordance with section forty-one of the Forests Act, 1918-1931, is hereby approved.

### SCHEDULE D.

#### ADVANCE TO TREASURER.

To be issued, if and when required, from the Public Account, to enable the Treasurer to make advances to the public officers, also advances for the Trading Concerns, and to other persons, or to a suspense account for the purchase of mechanical appliances, or for payments of deposits on Contracts or on account of other Governments, etc. Also to pay expenses of an unforeseen nature, chargeable against the Consolidated Revenue Fund, or the General Loan Fund; such disbursements to be transferred monthly to the respective Votes and Services, and to be shown as excesses thereon or as new items. The appropriation may also include expenditure in excess of the provisions of any Loan Act pending statutory authority for the raising of such moneys, and the appropriation may also include expenditure, to be charged to Loan Suspense Account, to be subsequently submitted to Parliament for specific appropriation. The whole amount to be adjusted subject as hereinafter provided, not later than 30th June, 1944: Provided that expenditure incurred for minor advances to other persons and for purchase of mechanical appliances may be adjusted over such period as the Treasurer may approve—£500,000.
