

LICENSING (PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE)

5° and 6° GEO. VI., No. XLV.

No. 45 of 1941.

AN ACT to extend the time for making applications under section sixty-two of the Licensing Act, 1911-1939, in respect of provisional certificates granted by the Licensing Court during war time.

[Assented to 15th January, 1942.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Licensing (Provisional Certificate) Act*, 1941, and shall be read as one with the Licensing Act, 1911-1939, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.
2. In this Act, unless inconsistent with the context—
“The prescribed period” means the period from the commencement of this Act to the end of the present war and twelve months thereafter. Definitions.
The prescribed period.
“The present war” means the war in which His Majesty is engaged at the commencement of this Act. The present war.
3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in sections sixty-one and sixty-two of the principal Extension of time with respect to provisional certificates.

Act, where since the fifth day of December one thousand nine hundred and forty, and prior to the commencement of this Act, a provisional certificate has been granted under section sixty-one of the principal Act to any person, such person may, subject to the requirements of any Commonwealth law or regulation affecting the same, make application under section sixty-two of the principal Act for a publican's general license in pursuance of such provisional certificate at any sitting of the licensing court held at any time during the prescribed period, and the time specified in such provisional certificate and the time limited by the conditions indorsed on or attached to such provisional certificate (whether such times or either of them shall have expired or not) are hereby extended until the expiration of the prescribed period and the said conditions shall stand amended accordingly.

Duration of
Act.

4. This Act shall continue in force during the continuance of the present war and for a period of twelve months thereafter and no longer.
