AN ACT to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to Credit of the Trust Fund and the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and to supplement grants made by the present Parliament during its last Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1932-33" for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1933.

[Assented to 4th January, 1934.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,-

Preamble.

W E, Your Majesty's Most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the Sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows (that is to say):—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1932-33.

There shall and may be issued and applied, for or Application of 2. towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, the following sums, that is to say:-

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Three Million Six Hundred and Nineteen Thousand and Eighty-seven Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the Trust Fund, the sum of Seven Hundred and Thirteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-three Pounds Eleven Shillings and Tenpence.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund, the sum of Two Million and Eighty-six Thousand Three Hundred and Eleven Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds.

3. (1) All sums granted by this Act, and the Acts men-Appropriation of supplies. tioned in Schedule A to this Act, towards making good the suppres. Supply granted to His Majesty, that is to say:-

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Five Million Four Hundred and Nineteen Thousand and Eightyseven Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the Trust Fund the sum of Seven Hundred and Fourteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-three Pounds Eleven Shillings and Tenpence.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of Two Million Six Hundred and Eighty-six Thousand Three Hundred and Eleven Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, and

(2.) All sums granted by this Act to supplement grants Advance to Treasurer. in confirmation of the expenditure from the vote, "Advance to Treasurer, 1932-33," for charges during the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, that is to say:----

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Two Hundred and One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two Pounds Eleven Shillings and Sevenpence.

From the General Loan Fund the sum of Four Hundred and Eighty-nine Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty-six Pounds Seventeen Shillings and Fourpence.

From the Trust Fund, the sum of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred and Ninety Pounds Ten Shillings and Fivepence;

SCHEDULE E.

ADVANCE TO TREASURER.

To be issued, if and when required, from the Public Account, to enable the Treasurer to make advances to the public officers, also advances for the Trading Concerns, and to other persons, or for payments of deposits on Contracts, or on account of other Governments, etc. Also to pay expenses of an unforseen nature, chargeable against the Consolidated Revenue Fund, or the General Loan Fund, or the Sale of Government Property Trust Account ; such disbursements to be transferred monthly to the respective Votes and Services, and to be shown as excesses thereon or as new items. The appropriation may also include expenditure in excess of the provisions of any Loan Act pending statutory authority for the raising of such moneys, and the appropriation may also include expenditure, to be charged to Loan Suspense Account, to be subsequently submitted to Parliament for specific appropriation. The whole amount to be adjusted subject as hereinafter provided, not later than 30th June, 1935: Provided that expenditure incurred in relaying Perth Electric Tramways and in belated repairs and relaying Government Railways may be adjusted over a period of five years—£500,000 FOR THE SERVICES OF THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE, 1933. IN Adjustment of the Appropriation "Advance to Treasurer," 1932-33.
