

CONSTITUTION.

No. 25 of 1927.

AN ACT to amend Sections forty-three and forty-five and the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899.

[Assented to 14th December, 1927.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title and
commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Constitution Act Amendment Act*, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, and shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

Amendment of sec.
43.

2. Section forty-three of the principal Act is hereby amended by substituting the word "eight" for the word "six" in subsections one and two thereof respectively.

Amendment of sec.
45.

3. Section forty-five of the principal Act is hereby amended by substituting the words "twenty-one thousand two hundred" for the words "fifteen thousand four hundred."

Amendment of
Fourth Schedule.

4. The Fourth Schedule to the principal Act is hereby amended by substituting for the word "six" the word "eight," and by substituting for the figures "1700, 1400, 1400, 6200, and 15400," the figures "2300, 2000, 2000, 8200, and 21200"; and by inserting after the words and figures "Second Puisne Judge 1400," the words and figures "Third Puisne Judge 2000."
