AN ACT to amend Section one of the Act 34 Victoriæ No. 7 relating to Divorce and Matrimonial Causes, and Section six of the Divorce Amendment Act, 1911.

[Assented to 7th October, 1929.]

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:----

1. This Act may be cited as the Divorce Act Amendment short title. Act, 1929.

Section one of the Act 34 Victoria No. 7 is hereby Amendment of 2. amended by substituting for the word "revise" in the eighth No. 7. line thereof the word "revive," and by adding to the section a paragraph as follows:----

VII., (Imp). tioned in this section and the court is satisfied that the means of the husband have increased, the court may, if it thinks fit, increase the amount payable under the order."

3. Section six of the Divorce Amendment Act, 1911, is Amendment of hereby amended by inserting after the words "foreign 1912. domicile" the words "and for the purposes of this Act a Domicile. deserted wife's husband, who was domiciled in Western Australia at the time of the desertion, shall be deemed to have retained his Western Australian domicile notwithstanding that such husband may have acquired a foreign domicile since the desertion."

The said section shall have effect as hereby amended from the commencement thereof.
