AN ACT to amend the Law relating to certain Public Service and Bank Holidays.

[Assented to 21st December, 1921.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Bank Holidays Amendment Act, 1921*.

Substitution of May Day for Proclamation Day as a holiday.

2. The Second Schedule to the Bank Holidays Amendment Act, 1899, is hereby amended by omitting the words "Proclamation Day (twenty-first day of October)" and inserting

in lieu thereof "Labour Day (1st day of May)"; and paragraph (b) of section sixty-four of the Public Service Act, 1904, is hereby amended by omitting the words "Proclamation of Self-Government (21st day of October)" and inserting in lieu thereof "Labour Day (1st day of May)."
