

NARROGIN RECREATION RESERVE.

11° GEO. V., No. XXV.

No. 25 of 1920.

AN ACT to vest in and authorise the acquisition by the Municipality of Narrogin of certain lands to be held as a ground for sports and for the purpose of public entertainment and exhibitions, and to be known as the Narrogin Recreation Reserve, and to empower the trustees of Reserve A7417 to sell the lands comprised therein, and to hand the proceeds to the said Municipality to be used in the improvement of the said Recreation Reserve, and the acquisition of lands to form part thereof, and for other relative purposes.

[Assented to 11th January, 1921.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Vesting of lands in
Municipality of
Narrogin.

1. (1.) The following lands are hereby vested in the Municipality of Narrogin for an estate in fee simple, that is to say—

Narrogin Recrea-
tion Reserve.
Schedule.

- (a) The lands described in Part III. of the Schedule to the Roads Closure Act, 1919, and delineated and coloured blue in the plan in the Schedule to this Act.
- (b) The lands comprised in Reserves A9595, 9360, and 14387, and Narrogin Town Lot 498, all delineated and coloured red in the said plan.

(2.) The lands so vested, together with the lands acquired under section two of this Act shall—

- (a) constitute the *Narrogin Recreation Reserve* (hereinafter called the "Reserve"), and be held as a ground for sports and the purpose of public entertainment and exhibitions under and subject to the provisions of this Act;
- (b) be deemed to have been set apart and proclaimed as a Class "A" Reserve;
- (c) be freed by force of this Act from all other trusts and purposes.

2. The said municipality is hereby empowered to purchase or acquire the lands delineated in the Schedule hereto and therein coloured green, either by agreement with the owner or owners thereof or as for a public work under and subject to the Public Works Act, 1902.

Power of Municipality to acquire certain lands. Schedule.

3. The trustees of the lands comprised in Reserve A 7417 (Dumberning A.A. Lots 112 and 164) are hereby empowered to sell the said lands, and to vest the same in the purchaser for an estate in fee simple freed from all trusts affecting the same.

Power of Trustees of Reserve A 7417 to sell.

4. Forthwith after the sale the said trustees shall pay the net proceeds to the said municipality, and the said municipality shall apply such proceeds in or towards the purchase or acquisition of the lands mentioned in section two and the improvement of the Reserve.

Proceeds of sale to be handed to Municipality for use under this Act.

5. The council of the said municipality may set apart from time to time any part or parts of the reserve for—

Powers of Council to set apart parts of Reserve for various sports.

- (a) a racecourse;
- (b) show grounds;
- (c) polo grounds;
- (d) tennis grounds;
- (e) bowling and croquet grounds;
- (f) cricket grounds;
- (g) football grounds;
- (h) sports grounds;
- (i) golf links;
- (j) trotting grounds.

Further powers of
Council.

6. The said council may, from time to time, on any part or parts of the reserve, construct or provide and maintain, control and manage or grant concessions for the construction, maintenance, control and management of—

- (a) grandstands, pavilions, seats, shelter-sheds, kiosks, and other buildings for the convenience of the public;
- (b) public refreshment rooms;
- (c) buildings for public entertainments or exhibitions conducted or authorised by the council.

And the said council may conduct or authorise public entertainments or exhibitions on any part of the reserve.

Power to make
By-laws.

7. (1.) The said council may make by-laws enacting and prescribing all such matters and things as it may be necessary or convenient to enact or prescribe for the purpose of carrying the purposes and objects of this Act into effect, or for ensuring good order on the reserve and the convenience, comfort, and safety of the people using the same; and may impose a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for the breach of any by-law.

(2.) The power to make by-laws shall include power to prescribe and levy tolls and charges for the right to enter or make use of the reserve or any part thereof or any building, enclosure or thing situated or being thereon.

Power to expend
ordinary revenue
for purposes of
this Act.

8. The ordinary revenue of the said municipality and such moneys as the council thereof may borrow (which, under and subject to Part XXIV. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906, the council is hereby authorised to do), shall be applicable towards payment of expenses incurred by the municipality in the exercise of any power conferred by this Act.

Short title.

9. This Act may be cited as the *Narrogin Recreation Reserve Act, 1920.*
