AN ACT to further amend the Stamp Act,  
1882.

[Assented to 10th February, 1915.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1914*, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Act, 1882, and the Acts amending the same. Short title.

2. No instrument by the Stamp Act, 1882, or any Act amending the same made liable to any stamp duty shall be received, registered, recorded, or enrolled by any public officer unless such instrument is duly stamped. Public Officer not to receive any unstamped instrument.

3. The schedule to the Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1913, is amended by omitting the words "mortgagee or obligee," in the eighth and ninth lines of the column headed "Person liable to penalty," and inserting in place thereof "mortgagor or obligor." Amendment of Schedule to Act No. 29 of 1913.

4. Where there are several instruments of collateral security for the same moneys as are secured by a primary security duly stamped, only one of such instruments shall be liable to stamp duty as a collateral security. Collateral securities.
