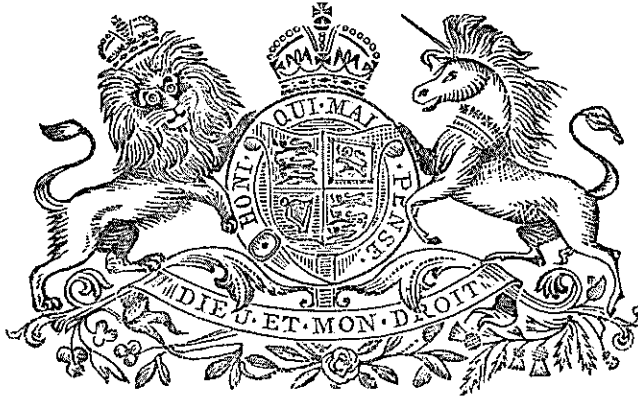

AN ACT to amend the Money Lenders Act,  
1912.

[Assented to 30th December, 1913.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Money Lenders Act Amendment Act*, 1913. Short title.

2. Section three of the Money Lenders Act, 1912, is hereby amended by— Amendment of  
sec. 3.

- (a) the insertion of the words “or who lends money at a rate of interest exceeding twelve and one-half pounds per centum per annum” immediately after the word “business,” in the fifth line of the section; and
- (b) the insertion of the words “at a rate of interest not exceeding twelve and one-half pounds per centum per annum,” at the end of paragraph (d) of the section.
