AN ACT to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and from Moneys to Credit of the Trust Fund and the General Loan Fund and from the Public Account certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and to supplement grants made by Parliament during its last Session in adjustment of the Vote "Advance to Treasurer, 1916-17," for charges during the Year ended the 30th day of June, 1917.

[Assented to 28th April, 1918.]

Most Gracious Sovereign,-

WE, Your Majesty's Most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Preamble. Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the Supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this Session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the Sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice

and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows (that is to say):—

Application of Moneys.

1. There shall and may be issued and applied, for or towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, the following sums, that is to say:

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of One Million Six Hundred and Sixty-three Thousand Four Hundred

and Thirteen Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the Trust Fund, the sum of Two Hundred and Eighty-two Thousand One Hundred and Forty-six Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund, the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty-one Thousand Seven Hundred

and Forty eight Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of One Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Appropriation of supplies.

Schedule A.

2. (1.) All sums granted by this Act, and the Acts mentioned in Schedule A to this Act, towards making good the Supply granted to His Majesty, that is to say:

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Three Million Three Hundred and Nineteen Thousand Four Hundred

and Thirteen Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the Trust Fund the sum of Three Hundred and Sixty-two Thousand One Hundred and Forty-six Pounds.

From moneys to credit of the General Loan Fund the sum of Eight Hundred and Fifty-one Thousand Seven Hundred

and Forty-eight Pounds.

From the Public Account for Advance to Treasurer the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds; and

(2.) All sums granted by this Act to supplement grants in confirmation of the expenditure from the vote, "Advance to Treasurer, 1916-17," for charges during the year ended the 30th day of June, 1917, that is to say:

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of One Hundred and Seventeen Thousand Four Hundred and

Sixty Pounds Fifteen Shillings and One penny.

From the General Loan Fund the sum of Thirty-four Thousand Seven Hundred and Two Pounds Seven Shillings and Eight pence,

From the Trust Fund the sum of Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-seven Pounds Six Shillings, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in Schedules B, C, D, E, F, G, and H.
