AN ACT to amend the Election of Senators Act, 1903.

[Assented to 27th September, 1912.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Election of Senators Amendment Act, 1912*, and shall be read as one with the Election of Senators Act, 1903, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.

2. Section two of the principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof a paragraph as follows:—
“The day fixed for the polling shall be a Saturday.” Amendment of 1903, No. 11, s. 2. See Com., No. 17 of 1911, s. 12.

3. Section three of the principal Act is amended by omitting from the third paragraph thereof the word “sixty,” and inserting in its stead the word “ninety.” Amendment of s. 3. See Com., No. 17 of 1911, s. 13.

4. Section seven of the principal Act is amended by omitting the word “seven,” and inserting in its stead the word “eight.” Amendment of s. 7. See Com., No. 17 of 1911, s. 16.
