

AN ACT relating to certain Permanent Reserves.

[Assented to 21st December, 1909.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. That portion of permanent reserve numbered ^{AA}4228, more particularly described in the First Schedule, being portion of Swan Location P, and now dedicated to the purpose of recreation, is hereby excised from the said reserve and dedicated to municipal purposes. Change of purpose of portion of ^{AA}Reserve 4228.

2. That portion of permanent reserve numbered ^{AA}1790, more particularly described in the Second Schedule, and now dedicated to the purpose of recreation, is hereby excised from the said reserve, and Change of purpose of portion of ^{AA}Reserve 1790.
is constituted public reserve number ^{AA}12229 and dedicated to railway water supply purposes.

3. Permanent reserve numbered ^{AA}11528 is hereby cancelled, and in lieu thereof Parkerville Lots 77, 93, and 243 are reserved to His Majesty for the purpose of a public park, and classified as of Change of site authorised.

4. That portion of permanent reserve numbered 7077^{AA}, situated Northward of the production Eastward of the South boundary of North Fremantle Lot P. 83, and now dedicated to the purpose of recreation, is hereby excised from the said reserve, and is constituted public reserve number 11656, and dedicated to the use and requirements of the Government.

5. All that portion of permanent reserve 4991^{AA}, known as Bunbury Town Lot 363, situated East of a line extending $31^{\circ} 29'$ from the North-West corner of Bunbury Town Lot 352 to the Western boundary of Russell Esplanade, is excluded from the said reserve and revested in His Majesty.

THE SCHEDULES.

First Schedule.

All that piece of land situated at Claremont, comprising three roods and thirteen perches or thereabouts, bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of Swan Location 2112, and extending $240^{\circ} 53'$ 2 chains $16\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence $0^{\circ} 12'$ about 4 chains 95 links; thence $90^{\circ} 12'$ about 1 chain 90 links to the North-West corner of said Location 2112; thence $180^{\circ} 12'$ along its West boundary to the starting point.

Second Schedule.

All that piece of land situated at Mount Barker, comprising thirteen and a-half acres or thereabouts, bounded by lines starting from the South-East corner of Reserve 1789, and extending $270^{\circ} 19'$ 11 chains 75 links; thence $180^{\circ} 14\frac{1}{2}'$ about 11 chains; thence $90^{\circ} 17'$ about 11 chains 50 links to the South-East boundary of Reserve 1790; thence North-Eastward along the latter to the Western side of the Perth-Albany Road and along it $346^{\circ} 5\frac{1}{2}'$ 8 chains $64\frac{1}{2}$ links to the starting point.
