AN ACT to enable Coventry Parade and Christina Parade, North Fremantle, to be dedicated to the public.

[Assented to 24th December, 1904.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section two hundred and twenty-one of the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900, it shall be lawful for the council of the municipality of North Fremantle to dedicate Coventry Parade and Christina Parade, in the said municipality, to the public use; and after publication of notice thereof in the *Government Gazette*, such dedication shall be deemed to be valid and complete, and such streets shall thereupon become public streets within the meaning of the said Act.

Power to dedicate Coventry Parade and Christina Parade, North Fremantle, to the public use.
