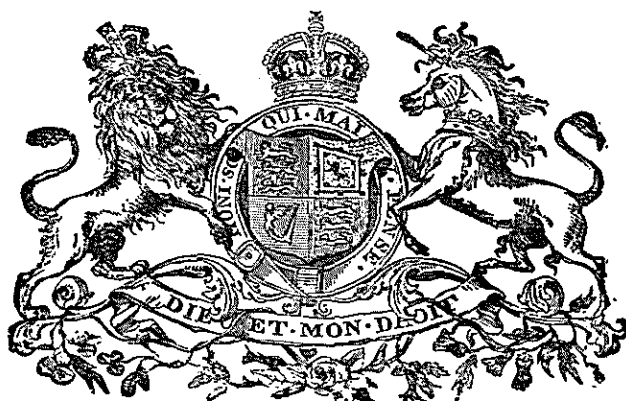

AN ACT to amend the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900.

[Assented to 28th November, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the *Municipal Institutions Act Amendment Act, 1906.* Short title.

2. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900, the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle shall be entitled, on the application of the owner or (if there be more than one owner) of the owners of so many of the houses and lands abutting upon the street or way in the said Municipality known as Douglas Street, more particularly described in the

Power to the Municipality of Fremantle to declare Douglas Street a public street.

Schedule hereto, as in rateable value constitute the greater part of all the houses and land so abutting, by writing under the common seal of the Municipality to declare the same to be a public street; and the said street shall become a public street and shall thereafter be under the management and control of the Council as a street within the meaning of the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900.

THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land marked and described as Douglas Street on Plan Number 1789, deposited in the Office of Titles at Perth.
