AN ACT to amend the Electric Lighting Act, 1892.

[Assented to 23rd December, 1905.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Electric Lighting Amendment Act*, 1905, and shall be read as one with the Electric Lighting Act, 1892, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.

2. Section two of the principal Act is hereby amended by striking out the words “‘council’ means municipal council,” and inserting in place thereof the words “‘local authority’ means the council of a municipality or the board of a road district.” Amendment of

3. Wherever in the principal Act the word “council” occurs, it shall be struck out, and the words “local authority” inserted in place thereof. “Local authority”  
substituted for  
“council.”

4. Wherever in the principal Act the word “municipality” occurs, it shall be struck out, and the words “municipal district or road district” inserted in place thereof. “Municipal district  
or road district”  
substituted for  
“municipality.”
