AN ACT to amend the Law relating to
Distress for Rent.

[Assented to 24th December, 1904.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Distress for Rent Restriction Act*, 1904. Short title.

2. After the commencement of this Act, it shall not be lawful to distrain any sewing machine, typewriting machine, or mangle, the property of or under hire to any female person, for any rent claimed in respect of the premises or place in which such sewing machine, typewriting machine, or mangle may be: Provided that any one such person shall not be entitled to have more than one sewing machine, one typewriting machine, or one mangle protected from distress under the provisions of this Act.

Sewing machines, typewriting machines, and mangles exempt from distress in certain cases.

3. From and after the passing of this Act the following goods and chattels shall also be exempt from distress for rent, namely, any goods or chattels of the tenant or his family which would be protected from seizure in execution under section one hundred and twenty-six of the Local Courts Act, 1904, or any enactment amending or substituted for the same.
